Sharia (/ ʃ ə r i ə /), Sharia law, or Islamic law (Arabic: شريعة [ʃaʔriʔa]) is a religious law forming part of the Islamic tradition. It is derived from the religious precepts of Islam, particularly the Quran and the Hadith. In Arabic, the term sharʔah refers to God's immutable divine law and is contrasted with fiqh, which refers to its human scholarly interpretations. (22) In 1 Bla.
