Radiating pain to pinky finger or the little finger occurs mainly due to the presence of Cubital Tunnel Syndrome. It is a condition in which the funny bone nerve or the ulnar nerve gets stretched or pressurized, which in turn causes numbness and tingling sensation in the pinky finger. Numbness and tingling in the arms and hands is usually caused by a pinched nerve in the neck or shoulder or a muscle "knot" in a shoulder or forearm muscle. Each foot has five metatarsal bones, which are collectively referred to as the metatarsus, and none of them have individual names. Instead they are numbered, starting with the big toe, which is known as the first, then continuing with the second, third, fourth, and fifth metatarsals (the fifth is the pinky toe).
